English

This term we will focus on:

- Story writing.
- Writing non-fiction texts with appropriate features and vocabulary.
- Reading myths and writing our own version.
- Play scripts.



- Instruction writing.
- We will also focus on paragraph construction and punctuation.

Science

Our science work will focus on:

- Evolution and Inheritance
- How living things have changed over time
- Fossils
- Compare and group different kinds of rocks on the basis of their simple, physical properties
- Describe in simple terms how fossils are formed

Maths

The areas of maths that we will cover this term include:

- Place value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
- Measurement



Discovery Curriculum

This term our main topic is 'Stones, Bones and New Metals.' We will continue to teach subjects through our Discovery Curriculum which has a cross-curricular approach to teaching and learning, taking into account what the children know and would like to know.

At the end of topic we will complete a 'Champion Challenge', where the children will use all of the skills that they have learnt to complete a group challenge.
