Homework

Reading

We always check reading record books so that we can award house points for regular reading, however, there are some children who do not appear to be practising their reading at home.

It is so important for children to practise their skills whatever stage of the reading scheme they are on, and these are the children who make accelerated progress. Please fill in your child's reading record with any comment you think is appropriate each time they read to you. **Books** will only be changed if there is an entry in the record book. When chil-

dren move up a level, this will be recorded in their books.

<u>PE</u>

PE will continue to be on **Mondays.** Please ensure that your child wears their school PE kit on this day and that any sweatshirts are named. <u>Snack</u>

This term our topic is 'Arctic Explorers—A Frozen World.' Our Discovery Curriculum has a cross-curricular approach to teaching and learning, taking account of what the children know and would like to know.
