### <u>Reading</u>

## **English**

*In English this term we will focus on the following:* 

- Narrative Structure: developing story writing with particular focus on characters in stories.
- Poetry: Acrostic poems, list poems and narrative poems.



Non Fiction: Persuasive writing, diaries and recounts.

Through these units important grammar, sentence and punctuation objectives will be taught as well as understanding of complex sentences and a wider use of connectives.

## **Maths**

In maths this term the focus will be on the following:

- Place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and division
- Statistics
