<u>Homework</u>

Homework will be given out on a **Tuesday afternoon** to be completed for the following **Tuesday morning.** In a change to last term, the previous week's Maths Fluency Homework will be marked on that day also. The Maths and Grammar tasks are usually related to the work that we have been doing that week . These activities should be completed in about 20 - 30 minutes with minimal adult support and are an important part of your child's learning through consolidation.

<u>Spellings</u>

Spellings have started this week. 10 spellings will be learnt each week. Correct spellings are highlighted and the 'unhighlighted' ones are to be part of the 10 for the next week. Your child knows their group.

<u>Reading Books</u>

Reading books will be changed as and when needed so please ensure your child brings their signed reading records and books to school every day.
