You will be able to discuss the ISP as part of parents evening with the class teacher

## **Before May Half Term**

The ISP targets from the Spring Term will have been evaluated and a new ISP will be sent out to you

## Before the end of year

The reviewed Summer ISP will be sent out to you with the annual report documents,.

## **How Do we Identify Special Education Needs?**

It is important to remember that staff have used evidence and their expertise to identify a barrier to a child making progress through the curriculum. They have identified that, at this time, a child has an additional learning need that requires support.

In school we will be making plans to address the following points:

- \* What can we change/adapt to best support an individual child?
- \* What whole class, targeted and/or specialist provision might help support?

In line with the SEND Code of Practise, we recognise that early identification of children with SEN is advantageous. The earlier action is taken, the more responsive the child is

likely to be.

- \* SEN pupils are identified through teacher assessment, information obtained from parents and pupil information meetings with subject leads and SENcos.
- \* Progress and provision are tracked and evaluated for all our pupils to help us identify the right provision for each individual child to help them make the best progress.

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If pupils continue to show lack of adequate progress over time, including:

- -Significantly slower progress than that of their peers starting from the same baseline
- -Failure to match or better their previous rate of progress
- -Widening attainment gap over time

They will be referred to the SENco and after discussion with parents, may be placed on the SEN register where a clear graduated response of assess, plan, do and review will take place.
